This residency program will include the following, under constant supervised training according to the LACVD residency guidelines.

- (a) Number of cases per day: 15-20
- (b) Most frequent skin diseases: allergic skin disease (canine and feline), ear disease, infectious skin diseases, referred challenging cases (immune-mediated, and others)
- (c) Members of the work team that are not part of the Residency Program
3 licensed veterinarians working at the dermatology practice, 15 veterinarians working different specialties at the veterinary hospital next door
- (d) Your qualifications and the resident advisor/s qualifications

Requirements for applicants

Licensed veterinarian from a recognized veterinary school program

3 minimum years of clinical experience

2 letters of recommendation (one previous work and other from a veterinary association or local college)

Background check or criminal record letter
