The residency will be carried out with a dual modality. Sixteen hours a week in my veterinary office in San Antonio de Padua, Partido de Merlo, Province of Buenos Aires and for 4 hours, to complete 20 hours a week, in the Faculty of Veterinary Sciences of the University of Buenos Aires, in the Agronomía neighborhood in the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires (CABA).

The office in San Antonio de Padua, called Centro Integral de Actividades Veterinarias (CIAV) is located at 243 Noguera Street in that city. It was opened 37 years ago (4-5-1987).

The Sarmiento railway train station is two blocks from the clinic and is the recommended means of public transportation. There is also a bus from CABA, the line 136, which arrives at the train station.

The CIAV consists of three offices, where patients, both canine and feline, are seen by appointment. The main office has an optical microscope with 4 objectives, one of them 100x immersion where the cytological samples and scrapings performed on each patient are observed. In one of the secondary offices, different procedures are performed such as biopsy sampling for histopathology with local anesthesia or general anesthesia. In this office, complementary studies to dermatological practice are also performed, such as video otoscopy and cryosurgery.

For each 4-hour session an average of a minimum of 3 new patients and 5 follow-up patients are seen.

The Veterinary Faculty hospital is at 4351 San Martin Avenue, CABA. Several bus lines approach the hospital, such as 146, 105, 133, 113, and 47.

. On Wednesday mornings, canine and feline patients are received in the Dermatology Service of which I have been a member since 1981 and of which I have been the head of the service since 2020.

In both places of attendance, consultations on average consist of 75% canine patients and 25% feline patients.

At the end of each day's sessions, a review of the cases seen will be carried out, focusing on the cases that presented the greatest difficulty. Intradermal tests are performed once or twice a week, always with appointments scheduled in advance.

Also, at the CIAV clinic, cryosurgery and video otoscopy procedures are performed with previously scheduled appointments for referred canine and feline patients.

The resident will be guaranteed the reading of different scientific articles since the library of the Faculty of Veterinary Sciences of the UBA has access to a large number of high-impact journals.

Resident requirements:

- Must demonstrate verifiable general clinical experience of at least 5 years.
- Experience in veterinary dermatology through courses, postgraduate courses, conferences and online or in-person scientific meetings of at least 100 hours.
