General characteristics of the place

The GADEV Quilmes veterinary dermatology center is in the beautiful city of Quilmes, within the southern area of the province of Buenos Aires. This city is located close to the large centers of Buenos Aires, being 40 minutes by train from the provincial capital (La Plata) and the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires.

The area has a large shopping center where you can access movies, theaters, clothing and fast-food stores. In addition, it is close to the national university of Quilmes (UNQUI), so the area is rich in bars and places suitable for social nightlife. It also has an extensive cultural agenda.

Access to the place can be by train from any of the nearby cities through the Quilmes line of the Roca train whose station is three blocks away. Numerous bus lines pass half a block away:

The dermatological center has been in operation for 3 years and receives referrals from clinical veterinarians in the areas of Quilmes, Berazategui, Bernal, Wilde, Villa Dominico, Solano, Rafael Calzada, Adrogué and Monte Grande.

It is equipped with two offices for dermatological clinic care, one of them exclusively for cats (cat friendly). These offices have:

- ✓ ISA-ARG® Wood lamp.
- ✓ Fire Fly® rigid videotoscope.
- ✓ Wheelsh Allym® conventional otoscope.
- ✓ PHOVIA® LED light lamp for photobiomodulation.
- ✓ Dermatoscope
- ✓ BRYMILL® cryosurgery equipment.
- ✓ Dermalroller 2.5 mm GADNIC®.
- ✓ Complete kit for Prick testing consisting of DUOTIP, LINCOLN®.

In addition, it has a laboratory made up of a coloring room in which routine quick colorations (DIFF QUICK® type) and special colorations such as Zheel Nielsen, BIOPACK® brand, are used.

The lab has a Nikon E200® microscope with integrated NIKON® Wi-Fi camera. This camera can be accessed from an application on any mobile device and view the images in real time.











The influx of patients to the GADEV Quilmes center is around 40 patients per week between first visits and controls.

The resident will also have the possibility of visiting the other care centers of the resident supervisor in La Plata, Monte Grande, Adrogué, Lanús, Temperley and CABA.

In addition, resident advisors have a case list of similar magnitude, ensuring the resident the possibility of completing the minimum number of cases in the required time.

The program will consist of the following activities:

Clinical care of specialized veterinary dermatology cases with a workload of 30 hours per week.

Monthly dermatopathology rounds by the tertiary educator with a load of 8 hours.

Journal weekly virtual meetings with the supervisor and/or advisors to discuss articles of scientific relevance. 4 hours per month.

Meetings of difficult cases with presentation by residents and discussion based on scientific evidence. 4 hours per month.

The study of basic sciences will be carried out autonomously by the resident and will have one hour per week to discuss what has been studied with the supervisor or advisors.

Access to books and scientific articles will be guaranteed by the resident supervisor, because the position at the university allows her to access to a large number of high-impact journals. If the resident requires information from journals to which the supervisor or advisors do not have access, the team has a wide network of contacts to access them.

The resident will complete a workload distributed as follows (depending on the type of residence chosen):

- ✓ Full-time residency program: 30 hours per week distributed over 5 days with 2 days of rest. You will have 15 consecutive vacation days during the summer break and 7 consecutive vacation days during the winter break. The payment will be US\$450 per month (US\$5,400 annually).
- ✓ Non-full-time residency program: 48 hours per month that will be distributed over 7 consecutive days every 3 non-face-to-face weeks, or 14 consecutive days every 6 non-face-to-face weeks.

Residents will have facilities to attend national and international dermatology meetings and, to the extent possible to the supervisor or advisors, free access to events organized by them will be granted.

Likewise, the supervisor and advisors have experience in managing courses and scientific meetings to guarantee the presentation of at least 6 conferences by the resident during the stipulated time.

Resident requirements:

- ✓ Must demonstrate verifiable general clinical experience of at least 5 years.
- ✓ Experience in veterinary dermatology through courses, postgraduate courses, diplomates, conferences and online or in-person scientific meetings of at least 100 hours.
- ✓ If you are a foreigner, you must take out health and personal accident insurance.
- ✓ Food and lodging will be the responsibility of the resident. The cost of living for modest rent and food is around u\$s 300 to u\$s 400 per month.
